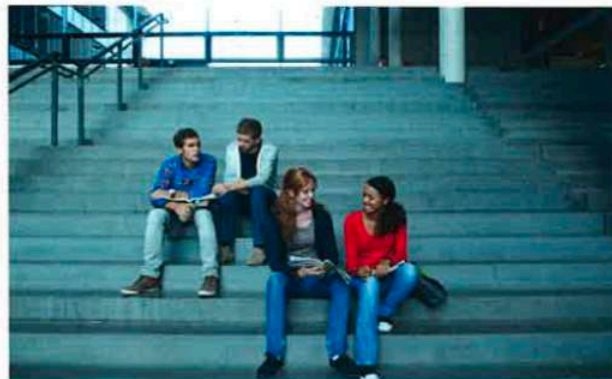

Who can apply?	Applicants with a first university degree (e.g. Bachelor)
What can be funded?	<p>a) A postgraduate or Master's degree programme completed at a university in Germany</p> <p><i>or</i></p> <p>b) One academic year in Germany as part of a postgraduate or Master's degree programme completed at a foreign university (first or second year of study, graduation abroad)</p>
Duration of the funding	<p>a) Between 10 and 24 months depending on the length of the chosen study programme</p> <p>b) Usually one academic year</p>
Value	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 850 euros monthly • Payments towards insurance cover • One-off study allowance • Travel allowance <p>Additionally, under certain circumstances:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Monthly rent subsidy • Monthly allowance for accompanying members of family • Offers for language preparation

Who can apply?	Applicants with a first university degree in the fields of Fine Art, Design, Visual Communication, Film, Music, Performing Arts, Architecture
What can be funded?	a) A Master's degree course/postgraduate degree course leading to a final qualification <i>or</i> b) A complementary course without degree
Duration of the funding	a) Between 10 and 24 months depending on the length of the chosen study programme b) One academic year
Value	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 850 euros monthly• Payments towards insurance cover• One-off study allowance• Travel allowance <i>Additionally, under certain circumstances:</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Monthly rent subsidy• Monthly allowance for accompanying members of family• Offers for language preparation

Who can apply?	Students in Bachelor's and Master's degree programmes who have completed at least two academic years at the start of the scholarship
What can be funded?	Attendance of language and area studies courses as well as special language / terminology courses that are offered by German universities and affiliated language schools
Duration of the funding	At least 18 teaching days in the period from June to December
Value	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• One-off scholarship payment of 950 euros (OECD/DAC-countries 1,125 euros)• Payments towards insurance cover• Travel allowance (exception: Western Europe)

Who can apply?	Students in Bachelor's and Master's degree programmes who have completed at least two academic years at the start of the scholarship, as well as doctoral candidates
What can be funded?	Attendance of language and area studies courses that are offered by German universities and affiliated language schools
Duration of the funding	6 weeks in January/February
Value	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• One-off scholarship payment of 1,875 euros• Payments towards insurance cover• Travel allowance



Research Grants – One-Year Grants for Doctoral Candidates

Who can apply?	Doctoral candidates and young academics and scientists (except postdocs)
What can be funded?	A research project or course of continuing education at a university or a research institute in Germany, in coordination with an academic adviser in Germany
Duration of the funding	7 to 12 months
Value	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 1,200 euros monthly for doctoral candidates• Payments towards insurance cover• One-off research allowance• Travel allowance <p><i>Additionally, under certain circumstances:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Monthly rent subsidy• Monthly allowance for accompanying members of family• Offers for language preparation

Who can apply?	Doctoral candidates and young academics and scientists (incl. postdocs)
What can be funded?	A research project or course of continuing education at a university or a research institute in Germany, in coordination with an academic adviser in Germany
Duration of the funding	1 to 6 months
Value	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 850 euros monthly for graduates• 1,200 euros monthly for doctoral candidates and postdocs• Payments towards insurance cover• Travel allowance

Who can apply?	Excellently-qualified young academics and scientists
What can be funded?	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Individual doctoral projects in Germany under the supervision of a university teacher or academic adviser <i>or</i>• Participation in a structured doctoral study programme (Ph.D.)
Duration of the funding	A maximum of 4 years
Value	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 1,200 euros monthly for doctoral candidates• Payments towards insurance cover• One-off research allowance• Travel allowance <p><i>Additionally, under certain circumstances:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Monthly rent subsidy• Monthly allowance for accompanying members of family• Offers for language preparation

Research Grants – Bi-nationally Supervised Doctoral Degrees / Cotutelle

Offer for: 140 countries

Who can apply?	Depending on the nature of the project: a) Bi-national supervision: Applicants who have completed a Master's degree or Diplom (in exceptional cases a Bachelor's degree) at the latest at the beginning of their scholarship ("sandwich model") b) "Cotutelle" procedure: Applicants who have admission to a doctoral programme at the latest at the beginning of their scholarship
What can be funded?	Research stays at a university or research institution in Germany for the preparation of a doctoral thesis, which is supervised and carried out bi-nationally. <i>Two options:</i> a) Stays in the context of a doctorate in the home country ("sandwich model") in coordination with the supervisors at the home university and in Germany; the doctoral degree is awarded by the home university b) Stays in the context of a doctorate in the "Cotutelle" procedure: After successful completion of the doctorate, the German university and the foreign partner university generally award a doctoral degree together
Duration of the funding	Total maximum 2 years <i>Option a)</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• 12 months with the initial scholarship award• Extensions depend on whether the previous scholarship period is assessed as successful by a selection committee

Value

Option b)

- 18 months with the initial scholarship award
- There is the possibility for a one-off study completion grant for up to 6 months
- The grant may also be used within the framework of several shorter stays within a period of three consecutive years

Value

- 1,200 euros monthly for doctoral candidates
- Payments towards insurance cover
- One-off research allowance
- Travel allowance

Additionally, under certain circumstances:

- Monthly rent subsidy
- Monthly allowance for accompanying members of family
- Offers for language preparation
- Allowances for travel and accommodation expenses for supervising university teachers

Who can apply? University teachers and scientists who have usually completed a doctoral degree and work at a university or research institute in their home country

What can be funded? Research stays at universities or non-university research institutes in Germany

Duration of the funding 1 to 3 months

Value

- 2,000 euros monthly for assistant teachers, assistant professors and lecturers
- 2,150 euros monthly for professors
- Travel allowance

Who can apply?	University teachers from the disciplines Architecture, Fine Art, Film, Design, Visual Communication, Performing Arts, Music
What can be funded?	Study visits in Germany for artistic cooperations with a host institution
Duration of the funding	1 to 3 months
Value	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 2,000 euros monthly for assistant teachers, assistant professors and lecturers• 2,150 euros monthly for professors• Travel allowance

Bilateral Exchange of Academics

Who can apply?	University teachers and scientists who have usually completed a doctoral degree and work at a university or research institute in their home country
What can be funded?	Research stays at universities or non-university research institutes in Germany
Duration of the funding	14 days (for certain countries: 7 days) to 3 months
Value	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 2,000 euros monthly for assistant teachers, assistant professors and lecturers• 2,150 euros monthly for professors• Travel allowance, unless otherwise regulated by bilateral agreements
