- a) A Master's degree course/postgraduate degree course leading to a final qualification or
- b) A complementary course without degree

Duration of the funding	7 to 12 months
Value	<ul> <li>1,200 euros monthly for doctoral candidates</li> <li>Payments towards insurance cover</li> <li>One-off research allowance</li> <li>Travel allowance</li> <li>Aditionally, under certain circumstances:</li> <li>Monthly rent subsidy</li> <li>Monthly allowance for accompanying members of family</li> <li>Offers for language preparation</li> </ul>

Duration of the funding	1 to 6 months
Value	<ul> <li>850 euros monthly for graduates</li> <li>1,200 euros monthly for doctoral candidates and postdocs</li> <li>Payments towards insurance cover</li> <li>Travel allowance</li> </ul>

Who can apply?	Excellently-qualified young academics and scientists
What can be funded?	<ul> <li>Individual doctoral projects in Germany under the supervision of a university teacher or academic adviser or</li> <li>Participation in a structured doctoral study programme (Ph.D.)</li> </ul>
Duration of the funding	A maximum of 4 years

# Who can apply?

- Depending on the nature of the project:
- a) Bi-national supervision: Applicants who have completed a Master's degree or Diplom (in exceptional cases a Bachelor's degree) at the latest at the beginning of their scholarship ("sandwich model")
- b) "Cotutelle" procedure: Applicants who have admission to a doctoral programme at the latest at the beginning of their scholarship

## What can be funded?

- Research stays at a university or research institution in Germany for the preparation of a doctoral thesis, which is supervised and carried out bi-nationally.
- Two options:
- a) Stays in the context of a doctorate in the home country ("sandwich model") in coordination with the supervisors at the home university and in Germany; the doctoral degree is awarded by the home university
- Stays in the context of a doctorate in the "Cotutelle" procedure: After successful completion of the doctorate, the German university and the foreign partner university generally award a doctoral degree together

### Duration of the funding

Total maximum 2 years Option a)

- 12 months with the initial scholarship award
- Extensions depend on whether the previous scholarship period is assessed as successful by a selection committee

	<ul> <li>Option b)</li> <li>18 months with the initial scholarship award</li> <li>There is the possibility for a one-off study completion grant for up to 6 months</li> <li>The grant may also be used within the framework of several shorter stays within a period of three consecutive years</li> </ul>
Value	<ul> <li>1,200 euros monthly for doctoral candidates</li> <li>Payments towards insurance cover</li> <li>One-off research allowance</li> <li>Travel allowance</li> <li>Aditionally, under certain circumstances:</li> <li>Monthly rent subsidy</li> <li>Monthly allowance for accompanying members of family</li> <li>Offers for language preparation</li> <li>Allowances for travel and accommodation expenses for supervising university teachers</li> </ul>
